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1. Objectives

GUIDE92 offers students a broad and balanced curriculum with a range of GCSE's and vocational qualification options to follow. As a provision we work alongside Base Schools for continuity of qualifications into GUIDE92; this means we will continue developing student's skills set and understanding to achieve the predicted grade for the qualification(s) they were previously following before being referred to GUIDE92.

2. Aims

- Provide a personalised curriculum for each student
- Develop leadership and life skills
- Continue what students have been learning within their Base Schools
- Offer work experience for KS4 students at our employer partner
- To encourage and motivate students to aspire towards further education, employment and training.

GUIDE92 curriculum is reviewed annually and qualifications offered are based on the need of the students that are referred to us. Great care is taken to ensure that the curriculum we offer provides clear and effective progression routes onto further study, training or employment. As part of this process, we will track the destinations of students after they leave us.

Our curriculum offer includes a variety of GCSEs and vocational courses. This allows us to offer nationally recognised outcomes for all students placed with us, including those on a short-term placement. Our Leadership & Life Skills programme supports in the developing students abilities to understand their own actions and empower them to self-reflect and regulate their own behaviour. After following a holistic approach to education, GUIDE92 students will be equipped to attend local college open days and employment fairs and successfully complete college application forms and interviews.

In order to personalise student experience at GUIDE92, data for each student is taken from the Base School (in conjunction with teachers and parents/carers) to formulate a holistic approach to development.
